Sundowning is a play that has been with me for a long

time. I first approached Helena Bell with the idea in 2014. Helena believed in *Sundowning* from the start. More than that, she pushed me to dig and dig again, deep beneath my characters and so pave the way for these complex and flawed working class women. These are characters seen too little on our stages, screens and crucially at the centre of our stories. Helena embarked on endless research with me and generously helped me find a way to turn a personal heartbreak into a proper story.

The play is not all autobiographical but the parts that are, are a love letter to my dear Nan, and both my grandparents. A thank you for the eternal love they showed me and my eternal guilt that I was never able to save Nan, save us all, from the depths of this vile and cruel illness. Because that's what it is, there's no getting away from it. There are small joys, glimmers of course, but still...

The glimmer, the hope, I sometimes feel is found in the fact that occasionally, for me, time doesn't really exist at all. Reality is in fact a blurred state of the past, present and future all melded in to one. With this I am able to believe my Nan is always with me, forever.
